Leif called for additional nominees and there were none from the attendees. A call for unanimous voice vote for the slate was made and passed with no objections.

George Noa made a Safety committee report covering the Community Emergency Response Team "Cert", Map My Neighborhood, "MYN", and the Neighbor Awareness program.

Cert is currently has 12 members and through recruitment is going to 19, it needs 22. Sign-up sheets were pointed out. Kris Ecklund is the captain of the EHHA Cert 9 team. MYN is led by Gretha Davis and she is in the process of getting equipment such as radio for its members. Awareness Program is not a policing function but educational in nature. Jeff Sickler is leading that effort and produced an article on things to do to make the neighborhood and yourself more secure.
